


TEXT CLUE/BACKGROUND KNOWLEDGE ADDITION

- What is it?
 - Used in Practicum
 - Inferencing
 - Creating predictions
 - Fiction
 - Text clues + Background Knowledge=Prediction
- I. Look for text clues about character.
- 2. Think about what you know about people in similar situations.
- 3.Write inference.



PICTURE IT


- What is it?

- I.Take a specific passage from the story.
- 2.Write and draw literal meaning of passage
- 3.Write and draw figurative meaning of passage




CONCEPT MAP

Benefits

- Organize new information
- Show what students know before a lesson
- Connects information
- Visualization
- Non-fiction and Fiction
- Can be used in all content areas
- I. Model how to find important concepts
- 2. Organize into categories
- 3. Read story or article
- 4. Use lines or arrows to show how ideas and concepts are related. Don't put every detail on map.
- 5. Reflect with partner how they made connections between concepts




